

Best Ways to Start your College Essays

Writing college essays is at times a mammoth task to accomplish. Those who start early are always in the driving seat while the procrastinators cobble up an essay just before the deadline.

Whether you start early or start late, you will have to perfect the opening of your essay. For many, the opening keeps changing and in the process keeps getting better with edits. Students should focus on getting the structure, the style, and the contents of the opening just right. .

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A good opening paragraph or lines should entice the reader into reading further. Within the first lines, hardly anything will be answered, however, the reader will be left with many questions asked. Revealing any resolve or the contents of your essay through an academic essay like a thesis statement sucks out the interest to read further for the reader. No matter how good of an essay it is.

A Descriptive Start

A good way to start the essay is to dive straight into a descriptive. It places you at the center of things and the reader at the center of the action. Through visual details and dialogues, the scene comes to life. The reader is guided by what you want to show and is clueless. The idea is to engage the reader with unraveling the scene around yourself and connecting the importance of ideas, culture, and events to yourself.

It can be your morning routine, a memory from the past, an event of cultural significance, etc. Be sure to hint at the importance of the scene.

With the right choice of words, you can many descriptions lively.

Twist in the Tale

Such an opening of the essay tells you what you are and what you have been, but then leads the reader to reveal the layer beneath that is the genuine you. This technique works with people

who lead two lives and this can be used as a twist: the one that the world sees, or the one that you let them, and the one that you know and the world hardly gets to see.

A bibliophile who is also a breakdancer on the side, a math wiz who runs marathons for fun, etc.

A Personal Philosophy

This might come up as a grandiose introduction but it is not unless its a personal philosophy that you can connect with or something that drives your life.

If the philosophy is unique and certainly defines you then it gives you off as a person who has the intellectual capability to think new things, to be an innovator, and a thinker. This essay opening might style your essay in light of the decisions that you took, the experiences you had, and your ambitions for the future.

Whether it's your version of a generational philosophy or a take on the morality of your choices, it makes for an impressive essay and probably a successful essay.

Shock and Confession

This type of essay works well for narrative essays that keeps you at the center of the story. Such an opening bursts onto the scene and the reader is usually taken aback. To shock and surprise, a reader is a great way to capture his or her attention.

"I didn't trouble me taking the step over the roof ledge; lying flat on my back, I watched the same ledge mock me... that troubled me. Still does, for to this day, my family thinks it was an accident. It troubles me that I cannot muster the courage to open up about it.'

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This example gains the readers' attention by the shocking aspect and evoking strong emotions. An essay can do this through visual cues only, but here the impact is amplified by adding the confession.

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
